

A short history of our Parish

Once upon a time, the centre of the North Shore was empty space, fields and streams. Then came the Harbour Bridge and Glenfield followed. First home buyers flooded into the area and the Catholics among them were part of the Northcote Parish. In 1971 a property on the corner of Wairau and Glenfield roads was purchased. In 1972 Fr Purcell from Northcote undertook a survey of the Glenfield area and as a result a parish was born and named St Thomas More. The first Mass was celebrated in the Glenfield Primary School Hall. In 1974 Fr Jude McCarthy was appointed the first parish priest. The Catholic population continued to grow. Fr Bruce Boland became parish priest in 1977. A parish committee and many community groups were established. The pastoral work was becoming overwhelming so in 1978 two Daughters of Charity nuns Srs Margaret and Barbara arrived and developed the Catholic Caring community which was active in helping to overcome the isolation facing many new families. By 1980 the population of Glenfield had grown from 2,000 (in 1970) to 30,000. In 1981 Fr Neville Browne became Parish Priest, a man of action - planning for a church got underway. Funds raised and in April 1982 the groundwork started for the church. Finally on 27 March 1983, the first Mass was celebrated in the new building. The parish church had a unifying influence and the Sunday mass count increased rapidly. In 1989 Fr Philip Sullivan arrived and was instrumental in establishing the Passionist Family Group movement. Because of all the activities within the parish, a parish centre had become a pressing need. The car park was finally sealed and extended and a new hall completed in July 1993. In 1998 Fr Philip moved on & Rosminian Fr John Bland became the parish priest with a new home being placed next to the original presbytery leaving the old house to become offices. In April 2009 Fr Benedict Francis became the parish priest. The Shine of Our Lady was built and the life size crucifix in the church was commissioned. Fr Alfredo Garcia became parish priest in 2015 and continues to minister to a very diverse community of age and nationalities who are united each week as we celebrate together being part of the Parish of St Thomas More.
