Exploring The WORD

Advent opens with a great promise: In the days to come the hope of a people who need God. ...The master is coming is also a promise, not a threat to breed fear, but to answer our cry. So Advent begins, not with thoughts of the past, with the coming of the Lord we celebrate at Christmas, but with the future, and the promise that He is coming back. We are encouraged to stay awake, and treat every day as the day the Lord will come; we do not do this out of fear for a Master who beats his servants, but out of love of a Master who always treats us with mercy. Nevertheless we must always be watchful, because we can grow sleepy and complacent, saying that we can leave this prayer or that confession or the other change in the way we live to tomorrow. Even as we look forward to the tomorrow of the Lord's coming, we must remember that it might be today!

ADVENT SPIRITUALITY WAKE UP!

Are you awake? Spiritually speaking? As we begin the liturgical season of Advent, we are given the future coming of the Son of God to ponder. As this passage goes on, Jesus says, "Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come." By the "day your Lord will come," we should understand three things. The first coming of Christ is obviously that which we most clearly ponder in Advent and Christmas. The unity of human nature with divine nature, in the Person of Jesus, is truly awe-inspiring. But that already took place long ago. Thus, a second coming of Christ that we must continually ponder is His coming by grace, every moment of every day of our lives, once we have chosen to freely give our lives over to His service, for His glory, in accord with His will. When we live with such an interior disposition by which we seek His ongoing "coming" by grace, then we will find that we need to continually "stay awake!" If we do not, then we can be certain that we will miss countless opportunities to become more united to Christ every day and to be used as an instrument of that very grace for His service and glory. If we do not diligently build a habit of becoming attentive to every prompting of grace in our lives, then we will, unquestionably, begin to become "drowsy" and will fall asleep, spiritually speaking. A wonderful measure of our daily attentiveness to the innumerable gifts of grace given to us every day is to also consider how attentive we are to the final and glorious coming of Christ at the end of time. Just as Jesus explains, most people will pay little attention to this final coming, presuming it will not even be in their lifetimes. But if you have that attitude, then you have completely missed the point. The point is preparedness—today, tomorrow and always. True preparedness for the final coming of Christ will not only help you enter the mysteries of these Advent and Christmas seasons by which we ponder the first coming of Christ, it will also help you form a habit of daily attentiveness to grace.

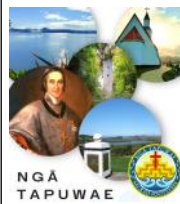

PROLIFE FACTS

The National March for Life was established in 2017 to commemorate the 40th Anniversary of the passing of the Contraception, Sterilisation, and Abortion Act, 1977. Now, with the very liberal Abortion Legislation Act 2020 regulating abortions in New Zealand, the role of the March for Life is even more critical. The fourth National March For Life is only a week away, at 2pm, on Saturday, 3rd December in Wellington. At 2pm, the march will officially begin, with participants proceeding to Parliament Grounds. The aims of the march are to celebrate life, peacefully protest the practice and legality of abortion, and increase public awareness of abortion, and its impact on women, families and society. The more than 500,000 pre-born babies who have lost their lives to abortion in New Zealand will be remembered. We invite you to participate in the 2022 March for Life and unite with other people of good will in New Zealand in the one common vision of making abortion unthinkable.
