

Exploring The WORD "Woman, You have great faith..."

Today is one of those occasions when, even though the second reading is not chosen to correspond to the theme of the Gospel and first reading, it does in fact fit very well. Indeed, much of the letter to the Romans is explained in this Sunday's Liturgy of the Word: the whole theme is summed up in this: the Messiah came first of all to the people of Israel, to whom the promises were made in the past - but it could not remain there. The good news had to be taken to the ends of the earth, so that all peoples, indeed the whole of creation could welcome the Messiah and take a place in the Kingdom of God. All nations are welcome on God's holy mountain: Let all the peoples praise you, O God!

Prayer This Week

O God our loving Father, I believe in you, my God. You called me into existence from nothingness and carefully watch over me. You have even numbered the hairs of my head. I trust in your infinite goodness, and I abandon into your loving hands my fears, my hopes, my needs, my desires, everything. I love you, Lord, and I wish to love you with all my mind, heart, soul and strength. Lord Jesus, Help me persevere in asking you for the good things I need. Help me overcome any shame or human respect, so that I can increase my faith, hope, and love for you. Amen

GOSPEL SPIRITUALITY BEYOND THE BOUNDERIES

The Canaanite woman was all alone: she was a Gentile in a Jewish world and a woman in a man's world. What makes her special is her determination: she turns to her advantage Jesus' statement about not giving food to the dogs. There can be no doubt that God's "care extends beyond the boundaries of race and nation to the hearts of all who live," and that God's house should become a house of prayer for all peoples (Liturgy of the Hours). It is therefore fitting that we should pray that the walls, which prejudice raises between us, crumble. But we must realize that an end to prejudice will not come easily, and it will be overcome only by the determination of the victims of prejudice. "O woman, great is your faith!" Jesus did not resist the determined woman; rather, he praised her determination. Those of us who work and pray for an end to prejudice must follow Jesus in praising the determination of those who are

claiming their rights as human beings.



PROLIFE FACTS

Here is a timely reminder for parents of female school students. Should a schoolgirl find herself

unexpectedly pregnant, she may well confide in the school counsellor, or the public health nurse. The schoolgirl may then be offered the option of an abortion, and there have been cases where the school counsellor personally drives the girl to the abortion clinic during the school day. There is no legal requirement for the schoolgirl's parents to be informed at any stage. It may seem incredible that a young girl can be taken for an abortion during school time without parental consent when parents must consent for their daughter to take a Panadol at school. A few years ago, Parliament debated whether parents should be informed after a mother had discovered that her 15-year old daughter, who was experiencing considerable mental distress and had attempted suicide, had been driven to a clinic by her school counsellor for an abortion. The majority of MPs voted to uphold the status quo, which is that the pregnant schoolgirl's right to privacy is paramount, and overrules a parent's right to know and give consent.
