Exploring The WORD

"I do not tell you to forgive seven times, but seventy seven times."

Jesus tells a dramatic story in the Gospel, to make a very important point: the desperate need in our world for forgiveness and reconciliation. How many chances do we give each other? As many as seven? How often do we shut doors on people, even family and friends, saying That's it; you've just gone too far this time: never again? When Jesus says that we must forgive seventy-seven times, he implies that we never stop forgiving, whatever happens. He doesn't just say this, however: even when they do the worst thing that could be done to him, nailing him to a cross, Jesus puts these words into practice: Father, forgive them...As his disciples, we must do likewise.

The Challenge of Forgiveness

"Forgive your neighbour's injustice." How often must I forgive the brother who wrongs me?

"Not seven times, I say, seventy times seven times."

Some of the social ills that we struggle against result in part from the refusal of people to forgive. Wars are fought and innocent people are killed, maimed, or displaced because people cannot forgive their neighbors for their actions or those of their ancestors. Our own society shows its own refusal to forgive in its obsessive clinging to the death penalty. The world of social evil stands in need of forgiveness. Those of us who are African-American are challenged by the gospel to forgive the slave masters of their ancestors as well as the racist descendants of those slave masters.

Those of us who are women are challenged by the gospel to forgive the sexist men who have colluded, through action or inaction, in the creation and maintenance of a 'man's world.' The victims of war are challenged by the gospel to forgive all the militarists of the world. "The Lord is kind and merciful; slow to anger and rich in compassion." The challenge is for us to become like God, who is our creator and guide. *Gerald Darrington/liturgy.slu.edu*

Meeting Jesus is the beginning of a new life. From this, men choose to follow or return to former lives. If men follow, they are converted to be like Jesus. This allows men to enter into shared lives, which we call communion. Men in communion with Jesus have everything (the summit of the spiritual life), but cannot keep it to themselves, or it will die. From communion men go on mission to help others meet Jesus. In transmitting faith, the cycle begins anew both for sharer and receiver. This is the fundamental cycle of Christian life handed down by the Apostles: Encounter, Conversion, Communion, and Mission.

PROLIFE FACTS

This weekend provided an opportunity for Cantabrian pro-lifers to participate in a March for Life, on Saturday 16th September. The aims were to: 1) provide participants with an opportunity to be part of a gathering that celebrates and supports Life; 2) remember the over 500,000 babies who have lost their lives to abortion since the 1970's; 3) increase public awareness of abortion, and its impact on women, families and society; 4) offer hope to those who are struggling after having an abortion; and 5) oppose the Abortion Legislation Bill that was passed by Parliament. The March for Life was a family friendly event. The official March commenced in Victoria Square, and involved walking in unison through Cathedral Square to return to where they started. Each year, the Catholic Church in Aotearoa NZ celebrates Support Life Sunday. This year, the Bishops' chosen focus is

The Consistent Ethic of Life.

Along with a social-media campaign and liturgical material due out later in September to assist, the bishops will be releasing a revised version of an important 1997 statement titled *Te Kahu o Te Ora – the 'Garment of Life'*.

This statement explores the application of what is a uniquely Catholic ethical framework to contemporary moral issues. Much has changed in the quarter-century since 1997, yet much remains the same.
