# **Exploring The WORD**

The Church's year is drawing to a close: in a few weeks we will be thinking very clearly about the end of time - but here we have a preview. The parable of the banquet is a link between the Gospels of recent weeks and the looking forward to the end times which will follow. The big danger is complacency: we are baptized, we go to Church, we've got our invites to the wedding. But when the big day comes, will we be ready for it?

Or will our thoughts be on the other things of life? Jesus speaks of himself as the Bridegroom, and today points out to the chosen people that they are in danger of missing the celebration.

Our faith is that the Bridegroom will come again; let us be careful that the same parable is not addressed to us.

# **Prayer for Synod on Synodality**

O Lord, look mercifully upon the little ones in the Church, look upon the hidden souls who sacrifice themselves for the Church, look upon all the tears, sighs and supplications of the true children of the Church, and through the merits of the Immaculate Heart of Your Most Holy Mother, arise, O Lord, and by Your intervention grant Your Church holy shepherds who, imitating Your example, will give their lives for You and Your sheep. O Lord, we beseech You: Through the Blessed Virgin Mary, grant us a holy Pope, zealous in promoting and defending the Catholic Faith, we implore You, grant it! Through the Blessed Virgin Mary, grant us holy and intrepid bishops, we implore You, grant it! Through the Blessed Virgin Mary grant us holy priests, who are men of God, we implore You, grant it! 
# SPEAKER: JANE THOMSEN. SCRIPTURE: John 2: 5 – 7

### PROLIFE FACTS

So-called "Safe Areas" were established by law on 19th March, 2022, and came into force in

August this year, preventing pro-life people witnessing against abortion within 150 metres of facilities offering abortion services. In December 2012, the Abortion Supervisory Committee alleged that women and staff accessing facilities providing abortion services were being harassed by protesters. The interesting thing is that when Voice for Life and Right to Life requested the Committee provide evidence, the Committee declined to do so. Both groups complained to the Ombudsman that their members and supporters were being smeared. The Ombudsman investigated and was unable to discover any evidence of harassment around New Zealand, except the presence of any peaceful protesters upset abortion clinic staff. Unfortunately, as a result of the "Safe Areas" law, sidewalk counsellors are now much more restricted in their ability to offer support to women who are unsure about going through with an abortion. Many mothers have chosen life for their babies because of pro-life witness and support outside abortion facilities, including in Hastings, where 38 babies were saved within a two-year period.
