Exploring The WORD

We continue to think about the Resurrection this week, from three different perspectives: the Gospel gives us another story of Jesus appearing to his disciples - this time the beautiful story of the meeting in Jerusalem, when Jesus proves he is alive and not a ghost by eating some grilled fish: he reminds the disciples of all that he suffered and had to rise so that the "repentance for the forgiveness of sins" could be preached to the whole world. The first reading shows us Saint Peter doing just that, as he addresses the crowd in Jerusalem on the day of Pentecost: he takes them through recent events (fifty days earlier), highlighting the important point, that he and the disciples can witness to the raising of Jesus from the dead, and calling them to "repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out." The second reading brings this into our lives: the resurrection is not just a historical event, which we remember. By baptism (which we renewed at Easter) we become part of Jesus in his dying and his rising, as he 'becomes the sacrifice that takes our sins away'. So all that Saint John tells us about the commandments and avoiding sin is our way of living the Resurrection.

"Touch me and see. "

The disciples are surprised, no, amazed, awed! He is alive! After death!

Christ, you let them feel and see your hands and feet, and you unlock their minds.

Oh Jesus, release our own minds. Let us see you in the beauty of sun and moon and stars, in the faces of the needy and forlorn, in all those risking lives to help, in the breaking of the bread, in loving our friends.

A Positive Force

Isn't it interesting that, right in the middle of this season of Easter joy, the church focuses our attention on the suffering of the messiah? The prophets announced long ago that God's messiah would suffer; "it is written that the messiah must suffer; Christ had to suffer." Jesus' followers never have been able to come to terms fully with the idea of redemption through suffering. Surely suffering cannot be good, cannot be God's desire for us! Jesus, however, turned suffering into a positive force, buying redemption with the single coin that has suffering and death on one side and resurrection on the other. The amount of suffering in our world is staggering. Apart from the suffering that comes naturally with life, there is the suffering we inflict on ourselves through injustice, violence and war. The suffering of Jesus continues in our day, and we still have difficulty seeing its victims as our redeemers. art museum that has attracted millions of visitors. It has an amazing array of displays, from a planetarium, botanical gardens and a zip-line adventure course. One of the exhibits is entitled "Fearfully & Wonderfully Made". This exhibit focuses on both scientific and Biblical truth about life in the womb, with breath-taking life-like models of preborn babies. A special lighting effect called "Pepper's Effect" enables visitors to get an inside view of the development the preborn baby experiences, including the growth of its bones and internal organs. Other parts of the exhibit include fascinating animations explaining what happens from the moment of fertilisation until birth.
